Finance & Funding

Part of the home's funding comes from fund-raising events organized by the church and public donations. The Home collects lodging fees at \$600-\$800 and at \$300 for Public Assistance recipients. Laundry service is at \$30.00 per month.

All Board members have signed conflicts of interest disclosure forms at the start of the Board term. If and when such situation of conflict arises, the Board member concerned shall make further disclosure and abstain from discussions and voting. Documentations of the declaration and the decision-making process are put in place.

Applications for admission are made directly by family members of the applicant or by referral from medical social workers. All applications are processed by the Operations Management Committee (consisting of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Treasurer and Executive Director).

Reserve Fund


